

ROADS CLOSURES & REOPENING

1 & 2 OCTOBER 2022



Dear Resident/Business Owner

The Great Scottish Run will take place around Glasgow on Sunday 2nd October. This is the first time the event has been held since 2019 and we are delighted to be able to stage it again and showcase Glasgow to thousands of runners and spectators.

The Great Scottish Run is organised by The Great Run Company in association with Glasgow Life and Glasgow City Council; we make every effort to ensure the safety of runners while causing as little disruption to the city and your local area as possible and request your co-operation to achieve this.

Super Saturday takes place on 1st October and has something for the whole family with around 3,000 kids taking part in the Toddler Dash, Family Mile and Junior Run. Saturday's events all start and finish in George Square with routes around the Merchant City. The action begins at 10:00hrs.

The 10k and half-marathon events on Sunday 2nd October will feature elite athletes as well as more than 20,000 club, charity and fun runners. Entries for the 10k, half-marathon and Super Saturday events are still open at greatscottishrun.com.

The 10k will start in George Square at 0930 and the half marathon will start at 1050 on Sunday 2nd October 2022. Why not come along and support the thousands of runners taking part?

Both the 10k and the half marathon will finish in Glasgow Green. Runners will be crossing the finish line from 0955 until 1500. There will be lots to see and do in Glasgow Green, so come along and join in the fun!

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

Within this leaflet you will find details of the wider road closures and parking restrictions that will come into effect for the event, along with specific information for your area of the city. I would be grateful if you can read and take note of the information provided.

Road closures and diversion routes will be sign-posted with every effort being made to keep traffic flowing as freely and smoothly as possible. For live traffic information and diversion routes on the day of the event, you can use Waze (online at waze.com or download the Waze app) for help with navigating around the road closures.

Please be assured that Emergency Service vehicles will not be affected by any of the restrictions.

Glasgow City Council's Parking Enforcement Unit will be patrolling these streets and any vehicles parked illegally or in suspended parking bays will be removed. Signage will be erected in the weeks leading up to the event dates and no-parking cones will indicate the temporary parking restrictions.

Bus services will be diverted due to the road closures. Passengers are advised to check with service providers for route alterations.

KEY ROUTES OPEN ON THE DAY

Key roads including the M8, M77 and the Clydeside Expressway will remain open to link up diversion routes and provide the main routes in and out of the city after roads close for the event. The Clyde Arc remains open all day, with cars using the suspended bus lane. An east/west route along the quays to the Broomielaw runs from the SEC Campus to Brown St all day. A north/south route across St Vincent St at Hope St/Renfield St and the King George V Bridge/Glasgow Bridge will remain open until 0845, and the cross routes on St Andrews Drive at Terregles Avenue and Nithsdale Road are open until 1115.

Roads will re-open throughout the day as runners pass through and roads are cleaned. George Square to Finnieston St will open at 1215; the M8 bridge from West St to the Expressway will open at 1245; Shields Road to Pollok Park at 1315; Haggs Rd to Bellahouston Park at 1410; Paisley Road West at 1430; and the Quays and Broomielaw at 1515.

Diversion routes to take you away from road closures and towards major roads are signposted across the city, and a number of bus lanes have been suspended to allow improved traffic flow whilst the event is on.

ROADS AFFECTED BY CLOSURES & PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Start: George Square - St Vincent St - Finnieston St - Clydeside Expressway - M8 Kingston Bridge - West St - Scotland St - Seaward St - Paisley Rd - Shields Rd - St Andrew's Dr - Hags Rd - Pollok Rd - Dumbreck Rd - Mosspark Blvd - Bellahouston Park - Paisley Rd West - Harvie St - Lorne St - Govan Rd - Clyde Arc - Lancefield Quay - Anderston Quay - Broomielaw - King George Bridge - Clyde Place - Glasgow Bridge - Clyde St - Saltmarket - Finish: Glasgow Green

ZONE 1

St Vincent St will be closed between 0415 and 1215.

Traffic will be permitted to cross St Vincent St at Renfield St (southbound) and Hope St (northbound) until 0845.

Traffic can flow east and west along Finnieston Quay, Lancefield Quay, Anderston Quay and the Broomielaw from the SEC to Brown St. Some of this will be in a contraflow.

Clyde Street and Broomielaw is closed westbound from Saltmarket to James Watt Street between 0415 and 1515.

Traffic will be permitted to cross Glasgow Bridge (southbound), King George Bridge (northbound), Victoria Bridge (both directions) and Albert Bridge (both directions) until 0845.

In order to get around St Vincent St during the closures, options include the M8 at the west and High St (A8) at the east.

The bus lane on Argyle St between Hope St and Union St and the bus lane at Nelson Mandela Place will be rescinded from 0400 until 1630 allowing general traffic to use these roads.

The 10k will start in George Square at 0930 and the half marathon will start at 1050 on Sunday 2nd October 2022. Why not come along and support the thousands of runners taking part?

Both the 10k and the half marathon will finish in Glasgow Green. Runners will be crossing the finish line from 0955 until 1500. There will be lots to see and do in Glasgow Green, so come along and join in the fun!

ZONE 2

St Vincent St and Finnieston St will be closed between 0415 and 1215. All properties south of St Vincent St and between Finnieston St and the M8 can enter and exit via William St to the M8.

Argyle St (between Minerva St and St Vincent St) will be closed between 0415 and 1215.

Stobcross Road and the Clydeside Expressway will remain open in both directions for the duration of the event.

The westbound Finnieston St off-ramp will reopen at 1245 allowing general traffic to use these roads.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. ZONE 3

Finnieston St (North of Clydeside Expressway) will be closed between 0415 and 1215.

Lancefield and Anderston Quay will be closed between 0415 and 1515.

Pacific Drive remains open, with traffic able to cross the Clyde Arc both north & south using the bus lane for the duration of the event. Stobcross Road and the Clydeside Expressway will remain open in both directions for the duration of the event.

The westbound Finnieston St off-ramp will reopen at 1245.

Traffic can flow east and west along Finnieston Quay, Lancefield Quay, Anderston Quay and the Broomielaw from the SEC to Brown St. Some of this will be in a contraflow.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. ZONE 4

The following roads will be closed between 0730 and 1100 on Saturday 1 October: Ingram St (from Queen St to Glassford St), Albion St (from Bell St to Trongate), Trongate, Glassford St, Hutcheson St, Wilson St (from Virginia St to Hutcheson St), Brunswick St and Candleriggs (from Trongate to Bell St).

The following roads will be closed between 0730 and 1230 on Saturday 1 October: George St (from Montrose St to High St), Montrose St (from George St to Ingram St), Ingram St (from Glassford St to High St), Albion St (from Ingram St to Bell St), Wilson St (from Hutcheson St to Candleriggs), Candleriggs (from Bell St to Ingram St), Shuttle St and Bell St (from Albion St to Candleriggs).

The following roads will be closed from 0415 on Saturday 1 October until 1500 on Sunday 2 October: George Square (southside), George Square (in front of City Chambers), South Fredrick St and Cochrane St.

The bus gate on Argyle St will be suspended on Sunday 2 October so that Argyle St and Trongate provide a link route between High St and the Clydeside Expressway.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

ZONE 5

Pacific Drive remains open, traffic can cross the Clyde Arc both north & south using the bus lane during the event.

Traffic can flow east & west along Finnieston Quay, Lancefield Quay, Anderston Quay & the Broomielaw from the SEC to Brown St. Some of this will be a contraflow.

Seaward St will be closed between 0415 and 1115. A contraflow on Seaward St between M8 slip road & Milnpark St will allow access and egress to business and residential properties around Milnpark St & Portman St.

Paisley Road West (between Helen St and Seaward St) will be closed between 0630 & 1430. Residents in Maclean Square, Plantation Square & Mavisbank Gardens and surrounding roads can use Govan Road all day to access Paisley Road. Residents on Craigiehall Place will not be able to exit onto Govan Road. Please park on streets unaffected by the closures.

Paisley Road West: Residents & businesses between Blackburn St & Mair St can cross from Portman St until 0900 and after 1100 to access and egress via the contraflow on Milnpark St. There will be no access and egress for a period between 0900 and 1100, however you can park to the south of Paisley Road West & cross the course on foot if necessary.

West St and Scotland St will be closed between 0415 and 1245. A contraflow on Scotland Street between Carnoustie Street and Shields Road subway station will allow access and egress to the station car park.

Shields Road & St Andrew's Drive will be closed between 0630 and 1315.

Traffic will be permitted to cross Glasgow Bridge (southbound), King George Bridge (northbound), Victoria Bridge (both directions) and Albert Bridge (both directions) until 0845.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

ZONE 6

Shields Rd, St Andrew's Drive and Haggs Road (between Titwood Road and Pollokshaws Road) will be closed between 0630 and 1315. Traffic will be permitted to cross St Andrew's Drive at Nithsdale Road and Terregles Avenue until 1035.

Dumbreck Road between Haggs Road and Mosspark Boulevard will be closed between 0630 and 1410. Residents that have driveways that exit directly onto the race route should park on streets off the route if they need to access or egress during the closure period.

The northbound off-ramp from the M77 to Dumbreck Road will be closed between 0630 and 1410. The southbound off-ramp as well as the southbound on-ramp and northbound on-ramp will remain open but will provide access and egress to Dumbreck Road to the north of the M77.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

ZONE 7

Shields Rd, St Andrew's Drive and Haggs Road (between Titwood Road and Pollokshaws Road) will be closed between 0630 and 1315. Traffic will be permitted to cross St Andrews Drive at Nithsdale Road and Terregles Avenue until 1035. Nithsdale Road crosses the M77 and links up with Dumbreck Road, allowing access to the M8 & M77.

Motorway traffic will be able to access and egress the M8 at junction 23, access the M77 (north and southbound) and exit the M77 (southbound only) at junction 1. Motorists wanting to head west on the M8 should 'use the loop': first go east on the M77, exit at the next junction and go round the Seaward Street loop, which allows traffic from the M77 to join the M8 heading west.

The section of Dumbreck Road between Haggs Road and Mosspark Boulevard will be closed between 0630 and 1410. A contraflow means the rest of Dumbreck Road remains open between the M8 and the M77 all day.

Residents that have driveways that exit directly onto the race route should park on streets off the route if they need to access or egress during the closure period.

Runners will be passing through Bellahouston Park between 1200 and 1430, which is a great place to support the runners. Why not come down and watch?

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

Mosspark Boulevard between Bellahouston Drive and Dumbreck Road will be closed between 0630 and 1410. Residents to the south of Mosspark Boulevard will be able to access and egress from Bellahouston Drive and Corkerhill Road for the duration of the event.

ZONE 8

Paisley Road West between Helen St and Seaward St will be closed between 0630 and 1430.

Traffic will be able to travel eastbound from Helen St to Broomloan Road.

Pacific Drive remains open, with traffic able to cross the Clyde Arc both north & south using the bus lane for the duration of the event. Access to Pacific Drive is available from Helen St and/or Broomloan Road and Govan Road.

Runners will be passing through Bellahouston Park between 1130 and 1400, which is a great place to support the runners. If you are free why not walk down and watch?

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

ZONE 9

Paisley Road West (between Helen St and Seaward St) will be closed between 0630 and 1410. Traffic will be able to travel eastbound from Helen St to Broomloan Road.

The westbound lane on Paisley Road West will remain open all day from Carillon Road to allow exit onto Dumbreck Road for the M8/M77. Residents who can access Clifford St from their roads can get to Carillon Rd.

Residents can return via Helen St to Broomloan Rd then park on streets on the north side of Paisley Road West until the road opens at 1430.

Until 1030 traffic from Clutha St to Carillon Road can also exit to the west.

Up until 0900 residents in the streets around Mair St and McLean St can cross Paisley Road West onto Portman St which will allow exit onto Seaward St and the M8. This will begin again from 1115 after runners have passed.

Pacific Drive remains open, with traffic able to cross the Clyde Arc both north & south using the bus lane for the duration of the event.

Lorne St, Harvie St and Govan Road (east of Festival Park) will be closed between 0630 and 1500. To egress this area during the run closures please park your vehicle on or just off Brand St or Govan Road to the west of Harvie St. This will allow egress via Pacific Drive and Whitefield Road.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

ZONE 10

Broomielaw and Clyde Street westbound from Saltmarket to James Watt St will be closed between 0415 & 1515.

Saltmarket is closed southbound at St Andrews Street. Southbound traffic on High St will be diverted onto Gallowgate and towards King's Bridge to cross the Clyde. Traffic can exit Bridgegate onto Saltmarket to head north towards High St.

Traffic will be permitted to cross Glasgow Bridge (southbound), King George Bridge (northbound), Victoria Bridge (both directions) and Albert Bridge (both directions) until 0845.

A dedicated lane between Jamaica St and Stockwell St/Bridgegate will allow access and into St Enoch centre car park and the wider road network.

No parking will be permitted anywhere on closed roads for the duration of the closures. Please note that any vehicles parked within the restricted areas will be removed by Glasgow City Council Parking Services contractors. Warning signage and 'No Parking' cones will help define these areas.

The Great Scottish Run will finish in Glasgow Green on Sunday 2 October. Runners will be crossing the finish line from 0955 until 1500. There will be lots to see and do within Glasgow Green, so why not come along and join in the fun.
